Discussion

John Eppolito - Candidate for School Board (District G - At Large) - The district cover half the county, I-580 westward. John has 4 children, with 2 still in the WCSD system. He has been a watchdog all school issues beginning with the attempt to force International Baccalaureate (IB) in Incline Village schools, which he defeated almost single-handedly in 2010 and chasing Common Core and data-mining issues since then. He is running now because kids are getting hurt. Consider the iPads given to kids to do their homework. One of the programs within the iPad was called Kahoot and it contained a 3-question survey called "Should I Kill Myself" which resulted in a Bishop Manogue student committing suicide last October. This same program was deemed inappropriate by WCSD in May 2019, but it will take until July 2020 for it to be removed from kids' screens. Learn more about John at www.JohnForWCSD.com.

Jack Heinemann - Candidate for School Board (District A) - This district covers South Reno, Washoe Valley and Incline Village. Jack was a 2019 graduate from Damonte Ranch HS where he was Class President. He is now a student at UNR. He is the candidate who has most recently "survived" the school system and believes there must be transparency and currently many programs rely on parents navigating the system to know when/where the meetings are. He believes it is the responsibility of the Trustees to do a better job of getting the word out, reaching out, visiting schools, kids, parents, custodians, school office workers. While this is a non-partisan position, Jack was quoted as saying in an interview with the Reno News & Review last 11/28/19: "If you're asking directly about my platform, right now I'm focused on the school board. But if we're talking about national politics, I consider myself a Democrat. And I think that voters have the right to know that." Jack's website is www.jackwh.com.

Jeff Church - Candidate for School Board (District A - At-Large) - Jeff's watchful eye has been focused on abuses of taxpayer money in City, County and School government for years. With his 30 years experience in the military and law enforcement, his primary concern is for student safety. WCSD is also very low in ACT scores (tests basic knowledge for college entrance) and going lower every year. It was just reported that Kristin McNeil - the interim Superintendent of WCSD - has just moved up the ranking of the 5 candidates being considered. This is an interim Superintendent who worked side-by-side with former, ousted Superintendent Tracy Davis for years and never said a word. Jeff was also the first to point out, over the last several years, that the cost of building a school is now over \$250M, when it used to be less than half to build the last school, Damonte Ranch HS. Jeff has also noted the misuse of WC-1 sales tax money, intended strictly for new schools, when in fact, it's been used for principal's salaries. www.WatchDogJeff.com

Paul White - Candidate for School Board (District G - At-Large) - Paul wanted us to think about the fact that you wouldn't want someone running the FAA who had never flown a plane and the current school board is largely made up of non-educators. Paul brings 3 decades of experience as a teacher and principal who turned around violent schools (including running a storefront school for gang members, which was written up in People magazine). Paul runs www.QOL-reno.org, which follows the homelessness problem and puts out a Hot Sheet and often the WCSD is on that hot sheet. <https://qol-reno.org/washoe-county-school-district/> Of the 4000 diplomas handed out by WCSD this last June, 3600 students were scoring below the national level for basic knowledge. He knows there is waste in WCSD and he will analyze WHERE the waste is. Why is the Ass't Superintendent (now interim Superintendent) #1 in the ranking of candidates for new Superintendent, when she aided and abetted the last, fired Superintendent for several years? Paul knows how things work and how to fix our issues, as he's had experience doing it in the past.

Terese Heurstel - Candidate for School Board (District A) - Terese was music teacher at the elementary level for 22 years before burning out. She received death threats and was told by administrators that was just part of the job. She believes in school safety and protecting student data and not sold to outsiders. Administrators are too plentiful and are paid more than teachers. She believes she is fair, but firm, but was not allowed to discipline students, even though certain rules are in place at school, but enforcing them often subjected the teacher to discipline. Terese would bring back law and order and the enforcement of the rules. She would also like to get rid of so many administrators and "implementation specialists" who probably should not be full-time.

Sandra Linares - Candidate for Assembly District 31 in Sparks/Spanish Springs. She has been an instructor at UNR on financial fraud and investigations for 8 yrs. She will face two challengers, both of whom have run before (Dave Espinoza in 2012 and Jill Dickman in 2014, 2016, 2018) and Sandra is the fresh face with a new perspective in the race and will shake things up. She walks every day and will walk/knock 6000 doors by the June Primary.

County Commissioner Bob Lucey will be on hand at the next meeting to discuss why he supports the Lands Bill. Let's bring the tough questions, while still being respectful.
