AB479 doesn't yet have a hearing date or time, but it's coming. This is the 5th legislative session that has tried to implement this. The 4 previous

Nathan Humphrey - with the National Right to Work Committee (https://nrtwc.org) is in NV with 3 others, two of whom are at the Legislature daily and 2 others are in communities, talking to the people (that's us!). There are a whole slew of bills currently coming down the pike in NV, that I found on the NRTWC website, https://nrtwc.org/legislation:

AB103 - Under current law, employees may be provided leave to do union work if the union pays the employer

AB108 - This bill would force employees to sit through a "union orientation" as part of the hiring process.

AB190 - This bill would repeal Nevada's ban on Project Labor Agreements, permitting state agencies to require their use, forcing contractors and subcontracts into a bargaining agreement with a labor organization.

AB355 - This bill would impose the requirements on grocery employers to maintain former staff for 90 days following a transfer of ownership, but would exempt workers under collective bargaining contracts, giving them a competitive advantage.

SB135 - This bill would force state employees to accept so-called "representation" of union officials as their exclusive agent in employment matters.

SB153 - This bill would force Nevada school supervisory employees to accept so-called "representation" of union officials as their exclusive agent in employment matters, as well as magnifying government union bosses' monopoly bargaining power by enforcing expired collective bargaining agreements into perpetuity until a replacement agreement is adopted.

SB158 - This bill would force police and firefighters in paramilitary command positions to accept so-called "representation" of union officials as their exclusive agent in employment matters.

SB231 - This bill would repeal Nevada's ban on Project Labor Agreements, permitting state agencies to require their use, forcing contractors and subcontracts into a bargaining agreement with a labor organization.

SB312 - This bill would mandate that private employers provide employees with paid sick leave at a rate of at least one hour of leave for every 30 hours worked, but would allow employers under a collective bargaining agreement to hold to a lesser standard of only 24 hours of sick leave a year, giving them a competitive advantage.

SB406 - This bill would impose new restrictions or requirements on employers, but would exempt workers under collective bargaining contracts, giving them a competitive advantage.

SB459 - This bill would impose new restrictions or requirements on employers, but would exempt workers under collective bargaining contracts, giving them a competitive advantage.
